

Course overview

The UAL Foundation Diploma at MPW is your route to studying Art and Design at the UK's best universities. It offers you the opportunity to explore a wide range of art and design disciplines in preparation for your chosen degree.

Widely recognised and respected, this qualification is often used to progress to a variety of top creative arts schools and universities, including UAL.

MPW London is a UAL Approved Centre for the delivery of the prestigious Foundation Diploma in Art and Design.

Age: 17+

Entry Requirements: Successful completion of schooling (year 11 or year 12 depending on the country) is needed

or 1 x A level or 2 AS levels or equivalent Level 3 qualification

or 5 x GCSEs at grade 4 or equivalent, including Maths and English

Students who do not meet these entry requirements will still be considered if they show promise in art, design, or media

English Language Level: 5.0 IELTS or equivalent. English language support is offered and timetabled to ensure admissions criteria of university destinations can be met

Course Length: 1 academic year (3 terms)



Pre-programme

Our Pre-programme is designed to give you the academic and English skills you need before starting your UAL Foundation Programme, A levels or Art Portfolio Preparation Programme. In addition to improving your English language skills, you will also gain knowledge in your chosen subject areas, as well as learning more about studying and living in the UK.

Your studies will be split between the English language programme (IELTS, approximately 60%) and creative arts subjects (approximately 40%). You can choose between a two or three term programme, depending on your circumstances.




- Age 16+ (under 16s accepted if approved accommodation or boarding at MPW London)

Creative arts at MPW

Creative arts are an important part of life at MPW London. We have been running creative arts programmes for nearly half a century, earning an enviable reputation for the quality of our teaching and the excellence of our students' work.

Our links with UAL and various other art focused universities enable students to take part in workshops, lectures and portfolio reviews with senior academic staff.

Combined with outstanding teaching facilities, dedicated tutors and a very popular annual art exhibition, it's no surprise that our art students gain places on the most creative and competitive courses at art schools and universities.

In recent years, three students have had their work displayed at the world-renowned Saatchi Gallery in London. Over the last three years, 50 students have progressed to UAL, with others progressing to prestigious universities such as Ravensbourne, the University of Edinburgh and Istituto Marangoni.

In 2020, we were delighted to be awarded the ISA Award for Excellence and Innovation in Fine Arts 2020.

We also publish the highlyregarded Getting into Art & Design, which is filled with insight into developing your portfolio and producing a great UCAS application. In addition, many of our teachers are wellknown artists and designers in their own fields.



Facilities

Our well-equipped, purpose-built studios are light and spacious, allowing students to explore a broad range of different techniques to inform their work, taking it to resolved pieces. The Creative Arts department includes dedicated studios for art, graphics, ceramics, textiles and photography, plus a darkroom for traditional photographic print processing.

Students have access to computers throughout the college for private study including in each of our three libraries. There is also a relaxing common room for students to enjoy and a popular cafe serving lunch, drinks and snacks throughout the day.





Location

MPW London's location in the heart of South Kensington means it is just moments away from iconic cultural attractions, where students can immerse themselves in the very best of British and global art and culture. These include the V&A, the world's leading museum of art and design, the Saatchi Gallery, the Natural History Museum, the Royal College of Art, the Serpentine Gallery and the iconic Royal Albert Hall.



May achieved A*A* in her A levels and is now studying at Central St Martins, University of the Arts London.








Art Exhibition

At the end of the summer term, the Creative Arts Department stages its annual exhibition, with displays on plinths as well as all around the exhibition walls. A diverse range of works showcase each area of the department including ambitiously staged textiles, ceramics, photography and graphics along with a comprehensive range of painting and drawing.

Guests, including VIPs, parents and staff, can explore vivid large-scale portraits, imaginative and surreal sculptures, atmospheric theatrical installations and exquisite architectural models. Also, on display are fine technical examples in photography, and decorative textile hangings.

The exhibition highlights work at all levels and draws praise from guest speakers such as David Webster, Associate Dean of Learning & Teaching at UAL, who consistently comments on the high calibre of students' work.



Arts programmes

In addition to the UAL Foundation Diploma, we also offer a wide range of study routes for creative arts students, including A levels, GCSEs and our art pre-foundation, the Art Portfolio Preparation Programme.

A level

A levels can be taken over one year, 18 months or two years in subjects including Art, Craft and Design, 3D Design/Ceramics, Graphic Communication, Photography and Textile Design.

GCSE

Taken over one or two years, students can choose to study GCSEs in subjects including Art and Design, Photography, Textile Design and 3D Design.









Art Portfolio Preparation Programme

This one-year programme is the ideal route for students who aim to study art, design, fashion or photography at foundation level at university in the UK.

Taken alongside one or two creative arts courses at A level, the programme develops your skills and focuses on portfolio development, a key entry requirement for most specialist art schools and universities. Through weekly workshops, you will build a body of work to demonstrate your creativity and the ability to develop your ideas into coherent and finished pieces.

Academic Entry Requirements

- Successful completion of local high school (either 11 or 12 year system) with good grades
- English Language Level:
- » IELTS 5.5 or equivalent (with no less than 5.0 in any single band) if taking 2 A levels
- » IELTS 5.0 or equivalent (with no less than 4.5 in any single band) if taking 1 A level






AMELIA MULLINS
